RWS Special Events

- ✓ Meet and Greets: This is the perfect opportunity for students and parents to reconnect with friends and meet new ones through play on the playground at RWS. (Classroom Teachers, Sam Page)
- ✓ All School BBQ: Join the fun on Friday, August 16, 4:00pm, at the All School BBQ sponsored by the Board of Trustees. It's a great time to meet trustees and new families. (Board of Trustees, Sam Page)
- ✓ Parent/Teacher Conference Days: There are three conferences per year, on August 15th-16th, October 17th-18th, and January 30th-31st, with an optional one in the spring. On Thursdays, there is an early dismissal to provide afternoon conferences to accommodate working parents. On Fridays, school is not in session and parents sign up for appointments with teachers during regular school hours. However, you should never feel the need to wait for a "conference day" to speak with a teacher about your child. (Classroom Teachers, Sam Page)
- ✓ Curriculum Night: Join us on Thursday, September 5th at 6:30pm for a short presentation by Dr. Peter Dry on "Creating Future-Ready Schools", and the opportunity to visit your child's classroom where the teachers will provide information to facilitate your child's success in the coming year. (Classroom Teachers, Sam Page)
- ✓ Picture Day: Each child will have his/her picture taken on Thursday, September 19th (Retake Day is Wednesday, October 16th). You may order a package of photos by returning the form and payment to the main office. Children should wear appropriate clothing for school pictures. (Eilleen Carrion)
- ✓ Middle School Field Trip: The Middle School students take a week-long field trip to Huntsman Marine Center at Tremont in New Brunswick, Canada from September 9th through 13th. Students spend the week learning about marine biology and their own classmates' talents. This is a great kickoff to the year and one our students anticipate for years! - ✓ Annual Giving Campaign: In addition to tuition, fundraising through the Annual Giving Campaign is a critical component to round out Rohan Woods' funding structure. Annual Giving takes place in the fall, and funds raised are designated for school operations and to cover the "gap" between the revenue generated by tuition and the true cost of operating the school. We ask for 100% participation from all Board of Trustees, faculty, staff, and families. Grandparents and alumni are welcomed to participate too! Pledges may be paid over time from October through June. Credit cards and gifts of stock are also accepted as payment for pledges. Any gift amount is appreciated, and we thank you for supporting our school! (Brooke Bennett)
- ✓ VIP & Grandparents' Day: On Friday, October 4th, a portion of the day is dedicated to a celebration with those who are important to our students. Invitations are mailed in September. This is a great opportunity for grandparents and VIPs to watch their special student in a musical performance, meet other RWS grandparents, and walk through the Scholastic Book Fair, all after enjoying breakfast at the Great Hall. Families are encouraged to arrange for a VIP or grandparent(s) to attend. (Eilleen Carrion)
- ✓ Halloween: A VERY BIG day at Rohan Woods! Each child may wear their costume to school for our early morning Halloween Parade on October 31st. Your child's teacher can help you with appropriate ideas for costumes. Each class arranges its own Halloween Party, and families are asked to help provide treats and/or activities for the parties. - ✓ Trunk or Treat: Meet in the parking lot Saturday, October 26th from 5:00pm-7:00pm for some (not so) spooky celebrations!

 Decorate the trunk of your car and bring wrapped candy to share as students go vehicle-to-vehicle telling all their jokes, doing their tricks, and getting delicious treats. (Brooke Bennett)
- ✓ Scholastic Book Fair: The Scholastic Book Fair is a great way to raise funds for our RWS library. Held through September 30th-October 4th, with an additional date in the spring to be announced. This is a great way to build your personal library and support RWS. (Brooke Bennett)

- ✓ Pancakes with Parents: Held on Friday, January 17th (EC thru 2nd Grade) and Friday, February 21st (3rd thru 6th Grade) beginning at 7:30am, children and their parents spend time together before the school day begins, enjoying a pancake breakfast and a magnificent performance by the students. - ✓ ERB Testing: Held April 2nd−11th, the standardized achievement testing is designed for schools with high standards and measures the key areas of achievement: reading, writing and mathematics. Parents receive individual reports on their students' scores in the summer. (Sam Page)
- ✓ RWS Fundraising Events: Each year, Rohan Woods hosts a few fun fundraising events to raise money for special school projects. These events would not be possible without the support from all our parents, including our Parent Volunteers, Class Ambassadors, and Parents' Association Officers who donate their time and talents to make each event a success. We are grateful to our families that help run and attend all our events! (Brooke Bennett)
- ✓ Open House: We will host three Open House tours for prospective parents on November 21st, January 15th, and April 15th. Invite your neighbors and friends! (Maura Comesana)

Other Important Information

- ✓ Parents' Association (PA): The PA is an organization that exists to provide opportunities for parents to meet each other, form friendships, and support RWS when called upon by the school. An administrative member is the school's liaison with the PA. Every parent is automatically a member of the PA. Each family is charged \$50 for PA dues every August. These dues "fill the pot" to kick start PA activities for the school year. (Brooke Bennett)
- ✓ Class Ambassadors (CA): Class Ambassadors are current parents selected to represent our school and support families throughout the year. Each class has 1-2 Class Ambassadors, and they are announced each summer. They meet regularly with the Administrative Team to gather information and share it with their class families. They are a great resource for new families, as well as someone you can always go to for questions and updates. (Brooke Bennett)
- ✓ Before and After Care: RWS has Before and After Care for busy families. Before Care begins at 7:15am and After Care begins at 3:15pm. EC through SK students will go directly to After Care. 1st through 6th grade students attend Homework Club until 4:00pm, at which time they will join After Care. After Care is available until 5:30 pm. While there is no charge for Before Care, After Care is billed at \$8.00 per hour, per student. (Liza Sullivan)
- Medicine: Children may take prescription or over-the-counter medicine while in school, but only with written instructions from the child's parent(s) and only if it is dispensed by Administrative Staff. Additionally, over-the-counter medication is dispensed as needed and as approved in the family portal. All written instructions and medications must be on file in the Main Office before a dose can be distributed. (Eilleen Carrion)
- ✓ Holiday/Birthday Celebration: Parents may bring a special pre-packaged or bakery-made treat to celebrate their child's birthday in school during lunch time. Most children bring enough to give one to each child in their class, and to offer one to the child's teacher, administrative members, and to any "special" teacher the child may have. Please refrain from providing fast food as a birthday lunch or providing birthday party items to hand out. It is of the utmost importance to speak with individual teachers regarding any food allergies in the class. (Classroom Teachers)
- ✓ Birthday Lunch: Parents are invited to eat the school lunch with their child to celebrate their birthday or half birthday. Notify the teacher before your arrival for this fun way to make your child feel special. (Classroom Teachers)
- ✓ Birthday Signs: Another way to celebrate your child's birthday and support the school is with a birthday sign for your student! The PA will provide a special sign for your yard from Rohan Woods School for your child to wake up to on their birthday. Order a sign through the office for a \$10.00 fee. (Brooke Bennett)

- ✓ Yearbooks: Yearbooks are free of charge and are provided to each student in May. Students are given time to ask teachers and fellow students for autographs. (Katina Truman)
- ✓ RWS Spirit Wear: A variety of Spirit wear items are on display in the Great Hall. If students, parents, siblings, or grandparents would like to show-off their school spirit, families may purchase items once a year at the beginning of the school year via an online school store. (Brooke Bennett)
- ✓ Volunteer Opportunities: We hope every parent becomes involved at Rohan Woods School. There are opportunities for everyone!
